California Wonder	Bell Pepper Green to Red	The absolute standard of bell peppers for decades	
Cayenne	Hot Chili Pepper	Mild heat, often used for smokey flavor and a bit of spice	
Cubanelle	Sweet Pepper	Sweet, but with a mild bit of spice. Popular in Italian and Spanish cuisine	
Flavorburst	Bell Pepper Lime green to yellow	Crisp, sweet, & juicy. Perfect for raw snacking
